

RESOLUTION 191(20)

June 17, 2020

WHEREAS, each year, on June 27th, the National Association for People Living with HIV and AIDS (NAPWA) organizes **National HIV Testing Day**.

WHEREAS, this year's theme is *Doing It My Way*, which highlights how and why people make testing part of their lives – on their own terms and in their own way. Doing It My Way encourages individuals to share their personal testaments of why testing is important, what motivates them to get tested and stay healthy, and how they get tested – be it at home, at the clinic, or with the company of a friend or loved one; and

WHEREAS, for more than 20 years, National HIV Testing Day has been a nationwide effort to reach millions of Americans at risk for HIV – too many of whom have no idea they are at risk – and increase their awareness of the critical importance of HIV prevention testing, early diagnosis and early treatment; and

WHEREAS, today, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Prevention in the United States, estimates approximately 1.5 million adults and adolescents are living with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection and, each year, another 50,000 become infected. With early diagnosis, individuals can be placed in treatment and care resulting in better health outcomes. Persons in treatment had a 96 percent reduction in transmission rate compared to persons not on treatment; and

WHEREAS, National HIV Testing Day encourages people to get an HIV test. The CDC recommends that everyone between the ages of 13 and 64 get tested for HIV at least once as part of routine health care. People at higher risk should get tested more often; and


WHEREAS, the only way to know if you have HIV is to get tested. Knowing your HIV status gives you powerful information to keep you and your partner(s) healthy; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Health Department has offered HIV Counseling and Testing for 26 years; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Health Department continues to support this effort; therefore, HIV counseling testing referral along with HIV treatment and care clinics will promote National HIV Testing Day the entire month of June; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the OCEAN COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH proclaims the 27th day of June 2020 as National HIV Testing Day in Ocean County and urges all citizens who are at risk to be tested.
